

## MLA Style – Works Cited

A Works Cited list is compiled in **alphabetical order by author**. If the work has no author or editor, then use the title of the article (1<sup>st</sup> choice) or book (in the absence of article title). If your source is missing one of the elements listed in the formats below, leave it out. (eg. Edition). If a citation requires more than one line, then the second and each subsequent line must be indented.

### Book with one author:

Author's last name, first name. *Title of Book: Subtitle*. Edition. City: Publisher, Year.

Eg.

Buckley, Joanne. *Fit to Print: The Canadian Student's Guide to Essay Writing*. 2<sup>nd</sup> ed. Toronto: Harcourt, 2003.

### Book with two authors:

(First) Author's last name, first name, and (Second) Author's first name and last name. *Title of Book*. City: Publisher, Year.

Eg.

Lunsford, Andrea, and Robert Connors. *The St. Martin's Handbook for Canadians*. Scarborough: St. Martin's Press, 2005.

### More than two authors:

Eg. Carter, Cherese, Charles Clark, et al. *The Central Asian States*. California: Greenhaven Press, 2001.

### Book prepared by editor:

Editor's last name, first name, ed. *Title of the Book : Subtitle*. Edition. Place of publication: Publisher, Year.

Eg.

Bromley, Carl, ed. *Cinema Nation: The Best Writing on Film From the Nation, 1913-2000*. 2<sup>nd</sup> ed. New York: Random House, 2003.

### Encyclopedia:

Last name of article's author, first name. "Title of the Article." *Title of Encyclopedia*. Edition.

Eg.

Likens, Gene. "Acid Rain." *World Book*. 2005 ed.

Eg. Article with no author:

"William Shakespeare." *Britannica*. 2004 ed.

### Article, Poem, Story from an anthology:

Last name of selection's author, first name. "Title of selection." *Title of Anthology*. Ed. Name of Editor. City: Publisher, Year. Page numbers.

Eg.

French, Ruth. "Stampede North." *Poems of Northern Ontario*. Ed. Jack Booth. Toronto: Holt, Rinehart and Winston, 1999. 92-93.

### On-Line Database: Magazine article (no author, begin with article title)

Article's author's last name, first name. "Title of the Article." *Title of the Magazine*. Date of publication: page Numbers. *Database name*. Name of Library. Date of access. Address of site.

Eg.

Bartlett, Tom "Youth Detention Systems." *Macleans* April 17, 2005:33. C.P.I.Q. NPC Library. 20 Sept. 2006. <http://find.galegroup.com>.

### On-Line Database: News article (no author, begin with article title)

Eg.

Coloroso, Barbara. "Keeping your kids out of the Matrix." *Globe and Mail* 24 May 2003. C.P.I.Q. NPC Library. 2 May 2007. <http://find.galegroup.com>.

### On-Line Database Article from an Ebook:

Author's last name, first name. "Article title" *Ebook Title*. Ed. Editor's Name. Vol # Ed. City: Publisher, Year. Page numbers. *Database name*. Name of Library. Date of Access.

Eg.

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Carson-DeWitt, Roalyn. "Typhoid Fever." *Gale Encyclopedia of Science*. Eds. K. Lee Lerner and Brenda Lerner. Vol. 6. 3<sup>rd</sup> ed. Detroit: Gale, 2004. 4146-4148. *Gale Virtual Reference Library*. NPC Library. 14 May 2007.

**Web Site: (no author, begin with title of article)**

Author's last name, first name. "Title of Article." *Title of Web Site*. Date of Publication. Web site address. Date of Access.

Eg.

Smith, Wendy. "The Globe." *Shakespeare's Theatre*. 23 March 2001. [www.shks.edu/english/theatre.html](http://www.shks.edu/english/theatre.html) 17 May 2007.

**Magazine Article: Print**

Last name of article's author, first name. "Title of the Article." *Title of the Magazine* Month and Year of issue: page Numbers of article.

Eg.

Millard, Candace. "Keepers of the Faith." *National Geographic* July, 2003: 110-115.

**Newspaper article: Print**

Last name of article's author, first name. "Title of article." *Name of Newspaper* Day Month Year: section of paper.

Eg.

Corbin, Martha. "What Every Student Should Know About Academic Honesty." *Toronto Star* 30 Nov. 2001: B4.

Eg. No author.

"Mad Cow Disease a Threat." *Brantford Expositor* 13 April 2006:A3

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
